

4. Interpretation

- CO2 emission in Use & maintenance is the largest as 70%. It is important to save energy during product usage, to make the life time of consumables(e.g. drum) longer and to reduce amount of toner used when printing. The condition in this CFP evaluation can be different from the one which the user operates under. A choice of the use condition (print mode, print conditions and so on) can reduce the CO2 emission during Use & maintenance stage.
- CO2 emission in Raw material acquisition is the second largest as 25%. It is important to reduce the size and weight, and to use low environmental impact materials.
- We evaluated the CFP with Canon's own data of raw materials weight and the general basic unit for the parts because it is difficult to collect the data for a couple of thousands of parts. Accordingly, the results may be different from the specific product specification.

As such, please be advised that this result would be a rough estimate.
